The City of Tucson is studying a modern streetcar system to connect major activity centers including Downtown Tucson, the 4th Avenue and Main Gate business districts, the University of Arizona, and the Arizona Health Sciences Center. This modern streetcar line could be the nucleus for a potential expanded regional system.

Transit Oriented Development is characterized by a mixed-use, medium density, and pedestrian friendly environment centered around transit stops. Concentrating residential and business activity in this way can be a powerful catalyst for economic growth.
