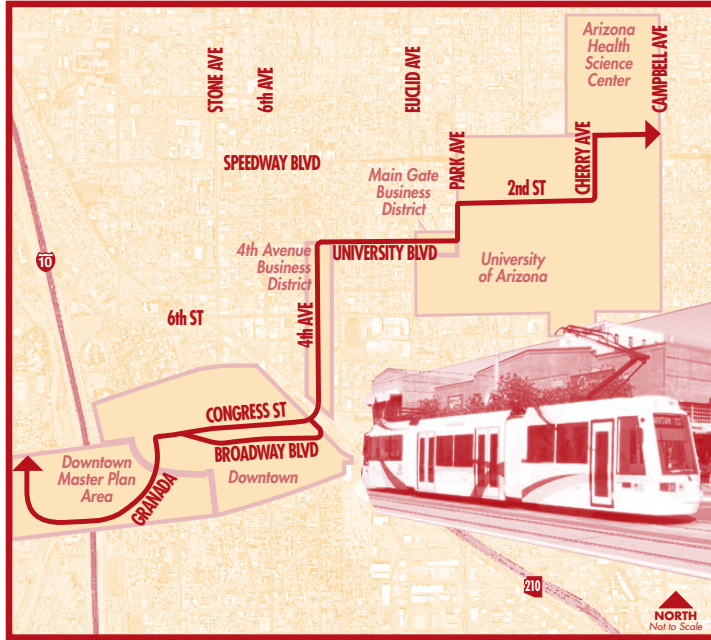
The City of Tucson, partnering with the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) and the Federal Transit Administration, is pleased to make available to the public the **Tucson Urban Corridor Draft Environmental Assessment Report** for public review and written comment. This is a major milestone for the Tucson Department of Transportation's (TDOT) **Transit on the Move** project. It will implement a modern streetcar line that connects major activity centers in the central core, including downtown Tucson, the Downtown Redevelopment area, the 4th Avenue and Main Gate business districts, the University of Arizona, and the Arizona Health Sciences Center. Local funding for this project was **voted on and approved** as part of the RTA vote in May 2006.

A public open house for public comments on the draft report will be held Monday, February 4, 2008 at the Joel Valdez Main Library, Lower Level conference room, 101 N. Stone Avenue, from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. A brief presentation will be given at 4:30 p.m. Written public comments will be taken.
